## *Arnaldo Niosco Audal* *September 10, 1948 - August 2, 2020*

Arnaldo “Dando” Niosco Audal was born on September 10, 1948, at Camarines Sur, Philippines. He was the second oldest of five children.

Arnaldo lived a life of serving others. He served in the Philippine Air Force for many years and as a member of St. Vincent Ferrer Catholic Church in Vallejo, he served in almost every ministry. Prior to his passing, he was deeply involved in the Audal Foundation – St. Peregrine, a project which goal is to build a hospital that is accessible to the underserved and underprivileged.

Arnaldo also valued education. Aside from instilling the importance of education to his children, he himself attained a bachelor’s degree and master’s degrees in Education. He taught at Verde Elementary School in Richmond, California, for 14 years prior to retirement. Through the Audal Foundation, he provided many scholarships to Bicol University students pursuing education degrees.

Arnaldo passed away peacefully on August 2, 2020, at the age of 71, after a long and courageous battle with cancer.

Arnaldo is survived by his sons Juan Carlos, James Edward, and Joseph Patrick; daughter Jennifer Ann; daughter-in-law Jamie; grandson Tyler; brothers Isidro and Paterno; aunt Fidela “Fe” and uncle Cleto Lastrella. His wife, Myrna, predeceased him in 2019.
